PHASED CLOSURE OF WENSLEY ROAD FOR RESURFACING

An important date for your diary is week commencing Monday 25 July when the Highways department is undertaking important road resurfacing along Wensley Road. This is not related to the Wensley Road Estate improvements, but we are able to pass on the information you need to know which is:

- What: Full road closure in both directions
- Where: Wensley Road (between the junction with Shaw Road and the Roundabout at Rembrandt Way)

- and Holybrook Road (between the junctions with St Saviours Road and Shaw Road)
- When: Monday 25 July Monday 1 August
- Time: 8am 5pm daily. NORMAL FULL ACCESS EVENINGS AND WEEKENDS
- Access: Still available to the Wensley Loop via St Saviours Road, and the bus will continue to run via this diversion.

There will be additional NIGHT CLOSURES between the Rembrandt Way Roundabout and the western junction with St Saviours Road on Wednesday 27 July and Friday 29 July from 7pm – 11pm. During the night closures, road access to the Wensley Loop will be cut off and will only be available to emergency vehicles.

These works have been delayed until the school holidays to minimise impact, and you'll see the benefit of the works in a vastly improved road surface.

No Parking signs will be displayed along the section of road which will be closed approximately two days prior to the works commencing. Parking provision around the loop will continue as before.

Phase 1 - new homes

Work on the foundations of the new homes is continuing. We know you haven't seen as much activity as expected in the last few months, due in part to needing to bring in a new piling contractor causing a delay. However you should see the buildings going up over the next few weeks, and we are still aiming to finish phase one, including all new homes and landscaping, by October next year.

In July our contractors will be installing drainage and floors and completing foundations, with some brick and blockwork beginning.

Construction of the new road was paused whilst we obtained the 'stopping up order' for the T junction at Wensley Road loop and utilities were diverted. Designs for the new road are also being reviewed. We are expecting work to deliver the road to begin again by the autumn.

Phase 2 - improvements to the tower blocks

We have begun the initial stages of the process of appointing a contractor to complete the improvement work to the existing tower blocks. This will include new entrances, new triple glazing for all flats, redesigned entrances, better waste facilities and bike lockers. We are expecting the work on this phase to begin early next year.

We want to ensure tenant views are taken into account throughout the process, so please put yourself forward for our tenant panel – see page 4.

GARAGES NEAR COMPLETION

Eight new garages have been built behind 51 – 65 Wensley Road, plus an additional 4 parking spaces. They are approaching completion now and hopefully you'll agree that they are a big improvement. We are expecting them to be available for letting by the end of August.

HELPING YOU DEAL WITH ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

Our ASB (Anti-social behaviour) team is here to help if people around you are making life difficult for you.

What you can report

Issues such as noise nuisance (persistent loud music and rowdy behaviour), problematic visitors and verbal abuse.

There are a number of other issues which you must report to Thames Valley Police, including threatening behaviour, criminal damage, violence, hate crimes and drug related issues. Please obtain a URN (unique reference number) for each incident you report to the police, and then let us know the details, including that number, so we can follow up your reports.

How to report problems to the ASB Team

- Keep a written record to send to us: Please include a full description of the issues you are witnessing, including any swear words that may be used.
- The Noise App: This is the preferred method we like tenants to use when reporting noise nuisance as it allows us to hear what you're hearing. This can only be used on smart phones e.g. iPhone and Android and can be downloaded from your phone's app store.
- **Reportable:** This is the newest method of reporting nuisance. It is designed for ease of use. This can only be used on smart phones e.g. iPhone and Android. and can be downloaded from your phone's app store.
- Email: Contact us directly at ASB.Team@reading.gov.uk, providing full details of an incident, eg. date and time, who was responsible, witnesses, the effect it had on you and details of any other agencies you reported to.
- Phone: Call the Council's contact centre on 01189 373787 and ask for the ASB Team.

How we can help improve things for you

- Talking to your neighbour to help them to understand the impact of their behaviour on others, and reminding them of their tenancy agreement
- Offering mediation: Helping you and the other person find a fair solution
- Issuing tenancy warnings: Warning offenders about breaching their tenancy
- In extreme cases we may take legal action against tenants which could include injunctions to prevent certain behaviours or possession proceedings to end a tenancy.
